Corrado Parducci, Architectural Sculptor

Over the course of a career that lasted more than half a century, Detroit based Italian-American architectural sculptor, Corrado Parducci (1900-1981), executed over 600 commissions, the vast majority for buildings in the Detroit area. Grosse Pointe Shores was his home from 1928 until his death in 1981. Join Dale A. Carlson, author of Corrado Parducci: A Field Guide to Detroit's Architectural Sculptor, as he discusses a dozen commissions found in the Pointes including Parducci's own residence, a handful of his most important Metro Area commissions, and a selection of his most significant work outside the State of Michigan.
