# From the Director, Jessica Keyser

As I write this letter, we are at the exciting junction of our "Library Reimagined" project. We're nearing completion of the interior renovations at the Woods branch and preparing to begin work on the long-anticipated building addition at the Central branch. We are thrilled to reintroduce the Woods branch to the community, with a brand new makerspace we've dubbed "The DREAM Lab," refreshed furniture, carpet and fixtures throughout the building, and expanded restroom facilities that will improve our accessibility for the entire community. These changes are the direct result of feedback from our community stakeholders. Watch for more information about when Woods will reopen and be sure to stop by, take a look around and let us know what you think.

While the Central branch construction is underway, we will be operating a "Central Annex" down the street at 120 Kercheval (previous Northern Trust Bank). At the Annex, you will be able to pick up holds, browse new and popular books, read magazines and newspapers, and even borrow a tool. The Annex will be open Monday-Friday, 9 AM to 5 PM. Again, watch for announcements when this opens sometime in June.

Meanwhile, at Central, construction crews will be hard at work building the long-anticipated addition to the historic Mid-Century Modern building. This small addition, which has been approved by the State Historic Preservation Architect, will provide the space to put in a much-needed elevator to the second floor, bring life saving features up to code, and double the youth services space. We will also have a new program room to meet community demand. Check our website and social media for updates.

As another school year comes to a close, we will be launching our annual summer reading program to encourage patrons of all ages to continue reading throughout the summer months. The theme this year is Oceans of Possibilities, and our library team has a fantastic line-up of events and activities to explore this summer. Join us and see what is possible at the Library!




## **Grosse Pointe Grows Seed Library**
