### Central Library Grand Re-Opening and 70th Anniversary Celebration

Thank you to everyone who came to the Central Library on November 24 to celebrate the grand re-opening and 70th anniversary of the Central Library—over 1,000 people in total! At the dedication of the Central Library in 1953, W. Hawkins Ferry said, “The ideas and planning of many people went into the realization of this building, but its final form as we see it today is the creation of architect Marcel Breuer. He visualized the building not as a mere repository of books but as a social, cultural, and civic crystallization point. Literature and art were made to be more accessible in an inviting home-like atmosphere.” It was our intention to honor that spirit of welcoming and accessibility in all of the recent improvements to the building, and having so many people of all ages celebrating in the library was truly affirming. We are thrilled to be open seven days a week to serve you, and we thank you for your support.

### New Website Accessibility Features

At the Grosse Pointe Public Library, we strive to be accessible and welcoming to all. To further fulfill this mission, we now provide “Recite Me” assistive technology on our website, which enables visitors to customize their experience to best suit their individual needs.

1 in 4 people in the US have a disability that can prevent them from reading and understanding online content. With the introduction of Recite Me on our website, those with a disability, learning difficulty, low visual impairment, or speak English as a second language, can access information barrier-free.

The toolbar includes a variety of features, such as a screen reader, reading aids, fully customizable styling options, and a translation tool with over 100 languages.
