At the beginning of 2017, I reported that we were hard at work creating a five-year strategic plan for the Grosse Pointe Public Library. I am pleased to announce that the plan is complete, and was unanimously approved by the Board of Trustees on June 27th. The planning process was an opportunity for us to evaluate everything we do, and envision the Library of the Future. In the planning process, we identified our core values as an organization, which include service, access to resources, intellectual curiosity, innovation, respect, and inclusion. From those core values, we adopted a new mission statement: To expand learning, inspire creativity, and connect our community.

The planning process included all of our regular full and part-time staff, the Board of Trustees, the Library Foundation, Friends, and key community stakeholders. We held four focus groups and conducted a community-wide survey. We truly did our best to hear from as many voices as possible. From the feedback we received, we identified our goals for the future. By the time you read this newsletter, we will already be rolling out some new services and resources. Hopefully, you will notice that we are out in the community more than ever, bringing the Library to the parks and special events.

We will be launching new digital services and are hard at work redesigning our website to make it easier than ever to use the Library anytime, anywhere! As we bring these new services to you, we are mindful of maintaining and enhancing the things that you've told us you love about the Library. The full plan is available on our website. Thank you to everyone who contributed to the plan. We will of course continue to receive feedback from the community, and my door is always open!


Tuesday, September 19, 7 p.m. Grosse Pointe War Memorial, 32 Lakeshore Drive

Metro Detroiters' home movie footage provides the heart of this documentary looking back at the cause, duration, and aftermath of the 1967 Detroit riot/rebellion. Those five days in July were among the most pivotal — and divisive — in the city's history, with the turmoil leaving 43 dead. While the impending 50th anniversary of the summer of '67 was the impetus for the film, the found footage in 12th and Clairmount captures a wide spectrum of Detroit life, from proud streetscapes to dance parties to neighborhood sporting events. Drawing from more than 400 reels of home movies from the era, other unearthed footage, and newly recorded oral history, the documentary was produced by the Detroit Free Press in collaboration with Bridge Magazine, WXYZ-TV and a group of metro Detroit cultural institutions, led by the Detroit Institute of Arts.


