ENJOY OUR PERKS!

A few weeks ago, I was having coffee with some friends. One of my companions was raving about a “new” service she’d discovered at the GPPL (Grosse Pointe Public Library) when she was gathering her financial documents for her tax preparer: FREE document scanning, sent directly to her email. She was truly pleased to have this service available at the Library, as it would have been very expensive to go to a commercial place to do her scanning, and even more to purchase a scanner at home. Our conversation made me realize that when we work at the Library, sometimes we take for granted that members of the public know about all of the great services, such as scanning, that we have to offer.

Another “perk” available at the GPPL that you may not be aware of is the statewide Michigan Activity Pass (MAP) program, which gives library card holders discounted or free admission to cultural attractions throughout our state, including the Michigan Science Center, Arts and Scraps, Michigan Outdoor Activity Center, SEA Life Michigan Aquarium and the Detroit Institute of Arts. You do not even have to go to the Library to take advantage of this program; simply login through our website and you can reserve your passes online.

As we look forward to a beautiful summer, I hope you will consider checking out one of our free telescopes, available at all three branches, complete with a custom stand, star charts, and convenient carrying case. Whether you are stargazing from your backyard or take the telescope on the road with you to a cottage or campsite Up North,

these telescope kits have everything you need to enjoy the night sky.

We are listening to your feedback! We’ve gotten lots of wonderful suggestions through the strategic planning process, and in some cases, we’ve been able to take action right away. Based on what we heard, we now have a new weekly format for the e-newsletter. If you are not currently receiving email updates from the GPPL, please give us a call, stop by or subscribe on our website. We’ve also made it easier to get and renew your library card. Bigger changes will be coming soon, including more convenient locations for picking up and returning library materials.

The Library Staff and Board of Trustees strive to deliver services and experiences that will delight you, inform you, and in some cases, save you money!
