Strategic Plan

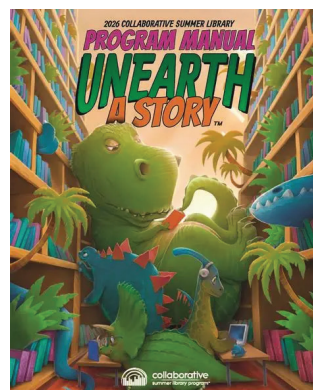
At the writing of this letter, we are in the final stages of developing the library's next strategic plan. We want to thank everyone who took the time to complete the survey, attend an engagement session, or participate in our retreat. The feedback we received will greatly inform our priorities in the months and years ahead. We learned a lot in the strategic planning process. The feedback we received emphasized the importance of the library as a community anchor and connector—a place where everyone is welcome and can find needed resources and feel a sense of belonging.

We learned that the GPPL is an outlier in the high percentage of digital circulation—half of our total circulation is in electronic and streaming content. This can sometimes put a strain on the library's collection budget, as we must purchase items in many different formats to meet the needs of our patrons. However, we are thrilled to have a community of voracious readers, and we will

continue to strive to get the materials you need in the format of your choice with minimal wait times. Stay tuned for the launch of our next strategic plan, and please continue to share your thoughts with us. This is your library, and we are here to serve you.
